

# UNDERCOVER AGENT SURVIVAL

This tuition-free 24-hour course is designed for law enforcement officers and will be beneficial for anyone interested in and/or currently working in an undercover capacity. During this training agents will review and discuss cases involving officers being robbed and/or injured during undercover operations. Agents will learn the safest techniques being used by undercover narcotic officers across the country. Attendees will participate in realistic practical exercises based on actual undercover operations. Upon completion of this course agents will be better prepared to recognize, react to, and survive a robbery or attack while conducting undercover operations. The instructors teach based on their experience as a narcotic officer.

- Indicators of a robbery
- Tactics for avoiding a robbery
- Tactics to survive a robbery
- Undercover agent rescue considerations
- Options for carrying a firearm while undercover
- Realistic practical exercises with simunitions

Instructor Joe Beliveau began his law enforcement career in June of 1990 with one of the largest law enforcement agencies in Illinois where he worked for 9 years as a patrol officer and drug interdiction officer in the St. Louis Metro East Area. In 1999, he was assigned to investigations where he has spent the last 16 years. Joe has held positions as an agent, supervisor, and director of a 20 man undercover narcotics unit, supervisor of a Meth Response Team, supervisor of a gun unit, and a supervisor of a multi-agency proactive street crimes unit in one of the most dangerous cities in the United States. Joe has been involved in thousands of undercover operations involving narcotics, firearms, car thefts, murder for hires, etc. He is also recognized as an expert by Illinois Courts as well as Federal Court of the Southern District of Illinois.

Instructor Chris Lutz began his law enforcement career as a deputy sheriff with the Monroe County Sheriff's Department in 2000. In 2007 he joined the Metropolitan Enforcement Group of Southwestern Illinois (MEGSI), a 20 man undercover narcotics unit working in the St. Louis Metro East area which includes some of the most dangerous neighborhoods in the country. In 2012, Chris was promoted to a squad leader where he was responsible for the daily operations of his four man squad. In 2014, Chris was promoted to the Deputy Director. Chris has earned the reputation of an excellent undercover officer and is often sought out by officers because of his abilities and experience.
